

**To the memory of HARRIET daughter
of the Right Hon. LORD BYRON died
June 25th 1828 aged 19 months**

Lord Byron the romantic poet died in 1824, indicating that the Lord Byron above was the Admiral George Anson Byron 7th Baron Byron who died in Brighton in 1868.

Admiral George Anson Byron, succeeded to the title of *7th Baron Byron of Rochdale*, on 19 April 1824. He held the office of Lord of the Bedchamber between 1830 and 1837. He was commissioned in December 1830, in the service of the Royal Navy. He held the office of Extra Lord-in-Waiting to HM Queen Victoria between 1837 and 1860. He gained the rank of Rear-Admiral in 1849. He gained the rank of Vice Admiral in 1857. He gained the rank of Admiral on 20 May 1862.

The headstone was removed during clearance in the late 1940's, and part of it now forms the path surface to the rear of the church

Harriet Byron's funeral cost £24.1.10, a large sum at the time and roughly equivalent to the annual wage of a domestic servant. The breakdown below comes from the records of Atree and Kent Funeral Directors
